Introduction, security and safety

What do these operating instructions tell you about?

Here you will find all the information you need to perform the jobs listed in the contents fast and reliably.

What do these operating instructions not tell you about?

They do not contain any basic or specific know-how about security techniques. The only information contained on this subject is what you need for operating purposes.

Therefore: make sure you are familiar with all security procedures and regulations in your sector (eg if there is an alarm).

The equipment should only be operated by persons who have been trained to do so!

For security reasons and to prevent incorrect operation, the user code that enables operation should only be communicated to these persons.

Notes on cleaning:

When cleaning surfaces, especially the display/control panel, avoid the use of corrosive and scouring agents, and make sure no fluid gets inside the equipment.

Use this key to enter coded mode.

Code



Use this key and the user code to arm partitions.

Arm



Use this key to bypass detectors or parts of the alarm system.



Use this key to reset faulted points of all areas to which a user has access.



Use this key to show faulted points, armed partitions, and malfunctions.

Use this key to terminate coded mode and to clear the walk test.

Use this key to call up the menu.

The paging keys can be used to move the cursor to the left or right.

User code/User authorization

Notes on user code

User authorization:

BE 300 LSN can be operated by several users with different authorizations.

Authorizations are issued to users (max. 40) in programming. Because of the different authorizations it is necessary for each user to have a separate user code.

User code = (user number + user password):

The user code (user number + user password) consists of max. eight digits and is composed as follows:



User number:

The user number consists of two digits. The number (01, 02, etc to 40) is firmly assigned to the user in programming and cannot be changed. The user number is entered before the user password and appears on the display.

User password:

The user password consists of between two and six digits (the minimum number of digits is defined in programming and is the same for all users).

The user password can be changed and the entry does not appear on the display.

Initially each user defines his own password.

Initial definition of user code:

To begin with there is a standard code (user number + 1357) for all programmed users.

For details of the initial definition of user code refer to chapter "Change own user code".

User code/User authorization

Notes on coded mode

Coded mode:

In coded mode a user can perform all operations for which he holds authorization. A symbol appears top right on the display to indicate coded mode (standby).

NZ 300 LSN ¢ Coded BOSCH

If no key is pressed for 1 min in coded mode, standby is initiated.

Error messages can appear if

- the user has no authorization,
- the user code is entered incorrectly,
- the particular operation is not possible.

Entering coded mode:

Depending on the operation the display automatically prompts "Enter code". In further operations the user code no longer has to be entered.

To perform an operation for which the user code is necessary, the user code is entered first (for an example, refer to chapter "Notes on menu use").

Entering user code:

1. Press the "Code" key.



2. Enter your user code (user number + user password, eg 02).



3. Confirm your entry with the "OK" key. The user code is checked. This takes approx. 2 s.



User code/User authorization

User authorization

BE 300 LSN can be operated by maximally 40 users with different authorizations.

User authorizations are issued in programming by selecting System-Manager, User level 1 or User level 2.

Notes on table:

X = operations firmly assigned to user, user is authorized to operate

P = operations can be assigned to any single user in programming

* = control panel case opened

Perimeter arm with door contact

1. Press the "Perimeter" key.



2. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



3. Use the paging keys to select the internal programs for activation. No selection is necessary if there is only one internal program (continue to point 4).



4. Press the "OK" key. Activation of the internal program is started.

The door contact is not activated until after the activation delay. The buzzer sounds at intervals during the delay (faster for the last 10 s). The room must be left in this delay.



5. Coded mode is no longer active after activation and the standby image appears on the display.



Perimeter arm

1. Press the "Perimeter" key.



2. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



3. Use the paging keys to select the internal programs for activation. No selection is necessary if there is only one internal program (continue to point 4).



4. Press the "OK" key. Activation of the internal program is started. After activation the standby image appears on the display.



Arming with door contact

Note: Arming with a user code is only possible for programmed areas without a block-type lock. The areas must not be on a walktest when activated.

1. Press the "Arm" key.



2. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



3. Use the paging keys to select the areas for activation. No selection is necessary if there is only one areas (continue to point 4).



4. Press the "OK" key. Activation of the areas is started.

The door contact is not arm until after the arming delay. The buzzer sounds at intervals during the delay (faster for the last 10 s). The room must be left in this delay.



5. Coded mode is no longer active after arming and the standby image appears on the display.



Arming

1. Press the "Arm" key.



2. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



3. Use the paging keys to select the areas for activation. No selection is necessary if there is only one areas (continue to point 4).



4. Press the "OK" key. Activation of the areas is started. After arming the standby image appears on the display.



Disarming with door contact

1. Triggering a door contact in the entrance areas produces a display of the time to deactivate. The buzzer sounds at intervals (faster for the last 10 s).



2. Press the "Disarm" key. The buzzer goes off. The display shows "perimeter disarm" or "disarm".



3. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key. All areas of the user are disarmed. The standby image appears on the display.



Disarming

1. Press the "Disarm" key.

The display shows "perimeter disarm" or "disarm".



2. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



Note: Immediate jump to point 4 if there is only one area/ internal program.

3. Use the paging keys to call up the areas/internal programs for disarming.



4. Press the "OK" key. Disarming is activated and the standby image appears on the display.



Arming/Disarming with block-type lock

Arming

- **1.** Requirements for arming:
 - NZ 300 LSN is on standby.
 - All doors and windows in areas are closed and bolted.
- Close the block-type lock. After arming of the areas this will be signaled by a buzzer or LEDs on the block-type lock.

Notes:

- If arming is not possible, a triggered detector can be exempted from surveillance (refer to chapter "Bypass").
- The areas must not be on a walktest when armed.

Disarming

- 1. Open the block-type lock. After disarming of the areas this will be signaled by a buzzer or LEDs on the block-type lock.
- **2.** Open the door.



NZ 300 LSN is on disarmed standby.

Arming/Disarming with key switch

Arming

Note: The key switch and BE 300 LSN belong to the same areas.

1. Operate the key switch.

Arming occurs after a delay. The buzzer sounds at intervals during this delay (faster for the last 10 s). The areas must be left in this delay.



Arming can be aborted during the delay by operating the key switch again.

2. After arming the standby image appears on the display.



Disarming

1. Triggering a door detector produces a display of the time left until disarming. The buzzer sounds at intervals (faster for the last 10 s).



2. Operate the key switch. The areas is disarmed. The standby image appears on the display.



Message display/Editing

External alarm, internal alarm, malfunctions

Message priorities:

Messages are displayed in an order of priorities. Within a particular message type the display is in order of time occurrence.

Highest priority...... intrusion alarms

- Priority 2 other alarms/messages (eg fire)
- Priority 3 malfunctions
- Priority 4 disable/bypass

Number of messages:

The + sign on the display indicates that several messages are present.

Turn off buzzer:

Use any key to turn off the buzzer of BE 300 LSN.

Turn off external sounder:

External sounders are turned off by disarming or automatically after max. 180 s.



Message display/editing

Display message

Notes:

Message display without user code:

Messages are displayed that belong to the areas of BE 300 LSN. Duress alarms are not displayed.

• Message display with user code:

Messages are displayed that belong to the user areas and the areas of BE 300 LSN. Duress alarms messages are displayed.

1. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through messages on the display.

Every 2 s the display changes between time and date.



- **2.** Further operations:
 - Refer to chapter "Bypass".
 - Refer to chapter "Enable/Disable detector".

Message display/editing

Display faulted points

Notes:

- Display faulted points without user code: Only those faulted points are displayed that belong to the areas of BE 300 LSN.
- Display faulted points with user code:

Faulted points are displayed that belong to the user areas and to the areas of BE 300 LSN.

1. Press the "Status" key. The detector number and type of message are displayed.



2. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the faulted points. Detectors are displayed in the order of their programming.



- **3.** Further operations:
 - Refer to chapter "Bypass".
 - Refer to chapter "Enable/Disable detector".

Message display/editing

Reset message

Notes on reset:

Messages have to be reset to put the system back on standby following the arrival of messages. The system can then be armed again. The areas must be disarmed for resetting.

VdS class C:

Malfunctions and a tamper alarm may only be reset by the installer.

User authorization:

The user must be authorized to reset.

If the user is not authorized to reset, the display will show the following. In this case inform the authorized person or the installer.



Resetting (see right):

If you are not yet in coded mode, the procedure is as described in the right column above.

If you are already in coded mode, the procedure is as described in the right column below.

Use the "Clear" key to quit coded mode.

1. Press the "Reset" key.



2. Enter your user code and press the "OK" key. All faulted points of all disarmed user areas are reset. The messages on the display extinguish as soon as all reset detectors are on standby.



1. Press the "Reset" key.



2. Press the "OK" key. All faulted points of all disarmed user areas are reset. The messages on the display extinguish as soon as all reset detectors are on standby.



Notes on menu use

Use of menus without user code.

- 1. Press the "Menu" key. The first menu "View detector" is displayed.
- **2.** Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus.



Call up the selected menu with the "OK" key.

3.

Use of menus with user code.

- **1.** Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.
- **2.** Press the "Menu" key. The first menu "View detector" is displayed.
- **3.** Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus.



View all detectors

Notes:

- Viewing detectors with user code: The detectors in the user areas are displayed.
- Viewing detectors without user code: The detectors belonging to the areas of BE 300 LSN are displayed. From point 2 onwards this is identical to viewing with user code.
- 1. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.
- **2.** Press the "Menu" key.

The first menu "View detector" is displayed.



3. Press the "OK" key.

The status of the first detector is displayed.



Use the paging keys (up ↓ and down ♠) to call up the detectors and their status one after the other. The detectors are displayed in the order of their programming.



5. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit the menu or coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



View alarm counter

- 1. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.
- **2.** Press the "Menu" key. The first menu "View detector" is displayed.



3. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus. Select the "Alarm counter" menu.



4. Press the "OK" key. The alarm counter is displayed.



The alarm counter cannot be deleted. Maximum entry up to 9999, then restarting at 1. **5.** Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit the menu or coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



View event log

- 1. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.
- **2.** Press the "Menu" key. The first menu "View detector" is displayed.



3. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus. Select the "View backup mem." menu.



4. Press the "OK" key. The latest event in event log is displayed. The display changes between time and date every 2 s.



5. If there are more events (max. 1024) in event log, you can call them up with the paging keys



6. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



Change own user code

- 1. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code (initially user number + 1357) and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.
- **2.** Press the "Menu" key. The first menu "View detector" is displayed.



3. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus. Select the "Change code" menu.



4. Press the "OK" key.



5. Enter the new user code. The first two digits are the same as the entry under point 1 and appear on the display. The remaining digits do **not** appear on the display. Confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



6. Enter the new user code once again and confirm your entry with the "OK" key. The new user code is saved.



7. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



Change user code for new user

Notes: If the authorization of one user is to be issued to another user, this can be done by the system manager. The new user is given a new user password.

A forgotten user password can also be renewed.

- **1.** Enter your user code and select the "Change code" menu (see previous page).
- 2. Press the "OK" key.



3. Enter the user number of the user to be changed. The user number appears on the display.

Now enter a new user password (this entry does not appear on the display).

(user code = user number + user password) Confirm your entry with the "OK" key.



4. Enter the new user code once again (user code = user number + user password) and confirm your entry with the "OK" key. The new user code is saved.



5. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



Display/change date and time

- 1. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.
- **2.** Press the "Menu" key.

The first menu "View detector" is displayed.



3. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus. Select the "Date/time" menu.



4. Press the "OK" key.



5. Position the cursor with the paging keys to overwrite the digit to be changed.



6. Overwrite the digit to be changed.



7. Press the "OK" key. The date and time are read into NZ 300 LSN.

8. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



SW version BE 300 and NZ 300, programming date

Note: The menus explained on this page can be used without a user code or in coded mode (refer to chapter "Notes on menu use").

1. Press the "Menu" key. The first menu appears on the display.



2. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus. Select the "SW version BE 300" or "SW version NZ 300" or "Programming date" menu.





3. Press the "OK" key.



4. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit the menu or coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



Display test

Note: The display test can be made without a user code or in coded mode (refer to chapter "Notes on menu use").

1. Press the "Menu" key. The first menu appears on the display.



2. Use the paging keys to scroll up and down through the menus. Select the "Test display" menu.



3. Press the "OK" key.

The buzzer sounds. The "Operative" LED extinguishes, the "Alarm" and "Malfun." LEDs illuminate.

4. Use any key to turn off the buzzer.

5. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit the menu or coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.



Bypass

Notes on "Bypass":

If arming of the system is not possible, a faulted detector can be exempted from surveillance (Bypass). According to VdS, only one detector at a time.

The installer must be informed after disarming.

Bypass is possible in the following chapters:

- Display message
- Display faulted points
- View all detectors

Bypass must be made in coded mode. The areas must be disarmed.

1. Call up the detector that is to be exempted from surveillance (Bypass). Refer to the chapters above for details.



2. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.

3. Press the "Bypass" key.



4. Press the "OK" key. Detector 10 is exempted from surveillance. Other faulted detectors can also be exempted with "Bypass".



5. Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key.



- 6. Arm the system.
- **7.** After disarming the detector is automatically included in surveillance again. The display indicates that the installer must be informed.



Enable/Disable detector

Notes on "Enable/Disable detector":

This is possible in the following chapters:

- Display message
- Display faulted points
- View all detectors

It may only be done in coded mode. The areas must be disarmed.

1. Call up the detector that is to be disable. Refer to the chapters on the left for details.



2. Press the "Code" key. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key.

3. Press the "Disable" key.



4. Press the "OK" key. Detector 10 is disabled. Other detectors can also be disabled with the "Disable" key.



5. Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key.



Enable:

When detectors are to be enable again, the steps are analogous to disabling as explained here.

The "Disable" key is then used to enable.

Walktest

1. Press the "Walktest" key.



2. Enter the user code and confirm your entry with the "OK" key. All disarmed user areas are included in the walktest. If the walktest is not completed within 15 min, it is automatically terminated.



3. Trigger all detectors of the areas. This is shown on the display and entered in event log.



4. Press the "OK" key. You see how much time remains for the walktest.



5. Press the "Escape" or "Clear" key.

The "Escape" key takes you back one step. Further operations are then possible.

or

Quit coded mode with the "Clear" key. The standby image appears on the display.
